

#### Contact details

There are times when we will need to contact you, including on the day if your child is absent and you haven't informed the school as to why. Do we have your most up to date contact details? If not, please contact the school on 03 5874 5295 or <a href="strathmerton.ps@education.vic.gov.au">strathmerton.ps@education.vic.gov.au</a> so we can update our records. Please include parent/carers' name, address, phone numbers, email address and emergency contact details. Please remember to contact the school if any of these details or your circumstances change.

#### Notify the school of your child's absence

Protecting the safety and well-being of children through the reporting and monitoring of absenteeism is the responsibility of both parents/carers and schools.

Please remember to call the school on 03 5874 5295 or email at <u>strathmerton.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> or log your child's absence using our school's IT platform Compass early in the morning if your child is going to be away or late for school.

#### Same-day notification of unexplained student absences

Our school will text/call you as soon as practicable on the day if a student is not at school and you haven't notified the school as to why. If you are notified by the school that your child is away without a reason, please contact us as soon as possible by calling/emailing on 0358745295 or

<u>strathmerton.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> to let us know where your child is. If we cannot reach you because we don't have your correct contact details (i.e. message notification fails, disconnected number), then we will contact any emergency contact/s nominated on your child's file held by the school, where possible, on the same day of the unexplained absence.

Please remember it is your responsibility to contact us to provide an explanation for your child's absence from school, and where possible, please inform us in advance of upcoming absences. #### **School Uniform**

There is an expectation that all students wear school uniform to school each day. This includes school t-shirt and jumper. Wearing of similar coloured clothing, navy or dark blue clothing, is acceptable. We are starting to see many students wearing clothing items that are not suitable or similar in colour to our uniform. The school office has uniform items for sale (jumpers and t-shirts) or alternatively families can source navy or dark blue items from stores such as Big W or K-Mart. Wearing of branded clothing items is not an acceptable alternative to school uniform and needs to be addressed by families. Please ensure all school uniform items are clearly labelled with your child's name.

#### **Reactive 8 Afterschool**

SkillZone will be running a pilot program here at SPS next term called ReActive8. It is a program to help students to find a balance between getting active and time on the screens. The ReActivate program is an inclusive games-based approach in which children can get active and social without even realising. It will be run on school ground on a Thursday.
