The annual NAPLAN tests for our Year 3 and 5 students are scheduled to start on Wednesday 12th March until Tuesday 18th March. The tests cover Reading, Writing, Language Conventions and Numeracy. All tests will be conducted online, except for the Year 3 Writing test which will still be paper based. The Year 3 and 5 students are currently preparing for these tests with their teachers. Introductions

Hi, my name is Kirra Thorne and I am the Service Leader at Uniting After School Hours Care, in Strathmerton.

I have been an educator for almost 8 years and I am passionate about quality care and learning.

We opened this service in October 2024 and we operate out of the hall at the Strathmerton Primary School, Monday to Friday from 3.30pm – 6pm.



Activities

Since opening some of the children's favorites have been playing cricket, building Lego and race day, where everyone had to build a car; whether out of cardboard blocks or Lego. Then we raced them to see which car was the fastest. The Mobile connector cars won this time.

On the first day back, we discussed what we like to do and what we are interested in learning about whether it be a sport, game, or something that the students expressed they wanted to learn about like, how fast are cheetahs or what are natural disasters? This led us to our first experiment, Rainbow volcanoes, which was so much fun. Did you know that there are three types of volcanoes or that the word volcano comes from the roman god of fire – Vulcan?





Happenings

At our service we have celebrated many different themed days since opening. So far this year, we have celebrated Chinese New Year - the year of the snake which sparked great conversation around snake awareness in our area. We also have celebrated world kindness day and next we will learn about Ramadan.

All the children get to have a chat around our floor book, which helps children have input in to their learning and what they want to learn about. We have learnt about earthquakes by doing an experiment with jelly. Next, we will be learning about bush fires, tsunamis and even hurricanes.



LITERACY:

Over the next five weeks, students will be completing reading and writing units on narratives. Students will be learning about different narrative genres such as; fairytales, realistic fiction, science fiction and fantasy. They will also be producing and illustrating their own narrative picture story book.

GRADE 4/5 NEWSLETTER

WELCOME

What a start to 2025 we have had. While the time has flown, and we are already halfway through Term 1 we have been incredibly busy in the classroom. Throughout the first 5 weeks, Grade 4/5 have been learning the routines and structures of the Workshop Model for Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Here we have been setting expectations and goals for 2025 while also finding our feet in our new environments.

Mathematics has seen Grade 4/5 immerse themselves into place value. This involves looking at numbers up to 100000, odd and even numbers and completing addition of numbers up to 100000.

For Quest, Grade 4/5 has been exploring animal adaptation and how they help an animal survive in the wild. For History and Geography Grade 4/5 have been researching facts about the First Fleet.

Literacy

In the coming weeks for Literacy Grade 4/5 will be working on their Narrative unit. This includes reading the different types of narrative stories to boost your child's understanding of how to write a narrative.

Throughout writing we will be looking at the structure of a narrative story. This involves building a larger word knowledge and understanding of the important elements of a narrative piece.

For our spelling lessons will continue to explore prefixes and suffixes, Latin and Greek routes of letters, sounds and words. This is an important step for their vocabulary knowledge.

Mathematics

For Mathematics, our students are going to be continue with Place Value but shifting towards multiples, products, factors, skip counting, using basic length measurements, estimating, rounding and designing simple survey's.

For something to work on at home with your child would be either skip counting or practicing their times tables.

History

In History lessons, Grade 4/5 students are learning about the First Fleet and Bushrangers. They are exploring the journey of the First Fleet, the challenges faced by early settlers, and the impact on Indigenous Australians. They are also discovering the lives of Bushrangers and their role in Australia's colonial past.

Science

In Science lessons, Grade 4/5 students are learning about animal and biological adaptations. They are exploring how animals adapt to their environments for survival and how these adaptations benefit humans, such as camouflage inspiring technology or animal behaviours helping medicine. This helps students understand the connection between nature and human innovation.

Welcome to the first class newsletter of the year! Over the past five weeks, our students have been settling into their routines and getting familiar with the classroom expectations, laying the foundation for a wonderful year of learning ahead. GRADE 5/6

What we are learning in Literacy:

Over the next five weeks, students will focus on narratives in both reading and writing. In reading, students will work on summarising key ideas, inferring the author's meanings, making connections to personal experiences, and decoding unfamiliar words. In writing, students will concentrate on organising their stories, their word choice, using correct sentence structures, and developing their unique voice. This unit will help students improve their comprehension and storytelling abilities, both as readers and writers. We're excited to see their skills grow throughout the process!

What we are learning in Mathematics:

Over the next five weeks in mathematics, students will be exploring key concepts such as decimals, BODMAS (Brackets, Order of Operations, Division, Multiplication, Addition, and Subtraction), measurement, and graphing. They will build their understanding of decimals through hands-on activities, practice using BODMAS to solve problems, and apply measurement skills in real-world scenarios. Additionally, students will learn how to collect and interpret data through graphing. This exciting unit will help strengthen their problem-solving and mathematical thinking in a variety of areas!

Science:

Students are currently exploring biological adaptations and how organisms change to survive in their environments. They will investigate various examples of adaptations in animals and plants, such as physical traits and behaviours that help them thrive.

History:

Students are exploring the lives of Australian bushrangers and explorers, focusing on their daring adventures and the roles they played in shaping Australia's history. This unit will help students understand the challenges, bravery, and impacts these historical figures had on the development of the country.
